## Crumbland Woods Walk Llanishen

DISTANCE: 3 miles/5km

**DURATION**: 1 hr 30 minutes - 2 hrs

A walk from the village hall through Crumbland wood and open farmland to reach the lane known locally as the Jubilee, which leads back to the village. Crumbland wood is lovely all through the year with bluebells in late Spring and fabulous colours in the Autumn. There are two short uphill sections and some parts can be muddy after wet weather. There are no stiles, so this a good walk for dogs.



## **Crumbland Woods Walk**

- Come out of the village hall building, turn left and walk into the field next to the hall. This is Glebe Field.
- Walk across the top of the field and leave by the exit at the yellow grit bin. You will come out onto a narrow lane. Turn right downhill.
- Walk downhill for about 100 m. Turn left at the finger post up some wooden steps onto a footpath.
- Follow the footpath until you reach a fork in the path. Take the lefthand fork onto a steep, rough track uphill.
- Continue uphill crossing a track/driveway with a house on your right.
- You arrive at the main road by a bus stop. Cross straight over the main road with care and walk through the gap in the hedge into the wood.
- You are now entering Crumbland wood.
- After a short distance, turn right along a wooded path parallel to the main road. Follow the path as it turns to the left away from the road keeping the fence on your right
- When you come to a crossroads of paths, turn right and follow the path keeping the fence on your right.
- 10 At the next crossroads of paths continue straight.
- When you see a house slightly uphill on your right, keep left heading slightly downhill.
- When you see a small car park on your right continue straight making your own way through the trees for a short distance to reach a farm track next to the field.
- Turn left and walk downhill.
- You will reach a big house on your left where you head right on a track with a row of trees on your right and a field on your left.
- Turn down the first track on the left walking downhill between 2 fields.
- Cross the stream at the bottom of the hill and follow the path round to the right.
- Turn left uphill keeping a row of trees on your right.
- Walk through the gate with a large Stone in front of it onto a lane. This is known locally as The Jubilee, the oak trees were planted to mark Queen Victorias Diamond Jubilee in 1897. Turn left and follow the lane uphill back to the main road.
- Cross the main road carefully and turn right on the footpath past the bus shelter.
- Take the lane on the left going past the 20 mile an hour signs, walking steeply downhill as the lane turns sharp left.
- You will arrive back at the village hall car park.
