



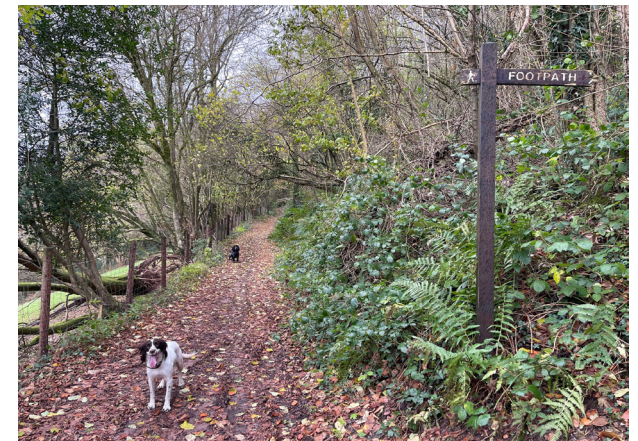
Prysg Woods Walk Llanishen

DISTANCE: 3 miles/5km

DURATION: 1 hr 30 minutes

A picturesque walk through quiet country roads with far reaching views over the Usk Valley to the Black Mountains and well-marked tracks and footpaths through ancient woodland. The path is steep in places and can be muddy particularly after wet weather.

Prysg Woods Walk

- 1** From the village hall car park turn left and walk along the road. Pass St Denis church and keep left as the road forks to the right.
- 2** Just after the old schoolhouse, keep left and head down a steep but short hill. As the road flattens out you will be able to see views across the Usk Valley. Keep following this road down a second steep hill.
- 3** Look out for a sign for Pryske Cottage, at this sign turn right along a track sign posted to Prysg Wood, through the double gates, passing the cottage on your left through a single gate into the woods.
- 4** After a short distance climb over the stile and continue along the footpath which bends to the left and down a steep hill.
- 5** At the bottom of the hill after a short flight of steps, turn right and follow the track.
- 6** Pass a small waterfall to your right, which depending upon the weather can turn into a stream across the path, take care as it can become boggy.
- 7** Turn sharp right at the sign with a horse and cart, walking up the footpath as it meanders back up through the woods.
- 8** At the top of the hill, and if you have your four legged friends with you, observing the 'Dogs on Lead' sign, go through the gate, keep left and follow the path through the first and second fields.
- 9** Head through the metal gate and turn left along the small road, keeping the fields to your left and houses to your right, you are back in Llanishen.
- 10** At the road junction take the road ahead of you, directly down the hill.
- 11** At the T-junction turn left, the old schoolhouse is on your left and walk back along the road, past the church and on to the Village Hall.
